**EIGHTH JUDICIAL CIRCUIT
JUDICIAL LAW LIBRARY COMMITTEE**

WHEREAS, the Judges and Judicial staff of the Eighth Judicial Circuit require professional law library services in order to perform their constitutional duties, and

WHEREAS, these library services are delivered in a variety of forms; from hard texts to electronic media in seven courthouses in six counties, and

WHEREAS, the Florida Supreme Court, through the Florida Legislature, is responsible to provide the necessary funding for the law library services, and

WHEREAS, the law library services are often co-mingled with local county law library services making the administration of services more challenging; It is therefore


ORDERED that the Eighth Judicial Circuit Judicial Law Library Committee is established pursuant to the following rules:

1. **Committee members.** The Committee shall consist of the following members: Circuit Judge Mark W. Moseley, Chair, County Court Judge Joseph M. Williams, Bridget Longridge, Lu Ann Smith, Beverly Carter, Jan Chesser, Karen Jordan and Chic Palmeri.
2. **Terms.** Members shall serve for a term of 3 years.
3. **Responsibility and Purpose.** The purpose of the committee is to coordinate and manage the acquisition and distribution of legal books and legal research tools needed by the judiciary and the staff of the judiciary. This committee shall have the responsibility to establish the policies and procedures for purchasing legal books and research tools needed by the judiciary and court staff.

4. **Communication.** The committee shall communicate its policies and procedures regularly with all judges, and it shall maintain a list of these policies and procedures on the courts intranet.

5. **Meetings.** The Judicial Law Library Committee shall meet quarterly and the meetings shall be open to any interested judge or court staff. The Chairman of the Committee shall request that the time and place of meetings of the Judicial Law Library shall be published to all judges and on the courts web site.
