

IN THE EIGHTH JUDICIAL CIRCUIT OF FLORIDA

AMENDED GENERAL ASSIGNMENT OF JUDGES ORDER

January 1, 2001 through June 30, 2001

Whereas, Florida Rule of Judicial Administration 2.050 requires the Chief Judge to develop an administrative plan for all courts within this circuit that is “compatible with the development of the capabilities of the judges in such a manner that each judge will be qualified to serve in any division;”

Whereas, the geography of this circuit requires temporary assignments of county judges in circuit court to provide prompt disposition of cases and to efficiently administer the courts, *see*, Article V, Section 11(b), Florida Constitution, and relevant case law requiring that the assignment of circuit court jurisdiction to a county judge be temporary; it is therefore

ORDERED the assignments set forth in this Assignment Order shall be reflected within a Master Calendar which is published at least annually and revised as needed based upon order of the Chief Judge and the Master Calendar is hereby incorporated to this General Assignment Order.

PROCEDURE FOR CALENDARING CIRCUIT COURT CASES

All cases under circuit court jurisdiction shall be calendared before the circuit judge assigned to the division in which the case has been filed. When a rule, statute or procedure mandates expedited judicial action on a matter and the judge assigned to the division is unavailable, the Chief Judge shall assign a judge to hear the case or cases pursuant to this order. The acting, presiding judge will be the next available circuit judge or a county judge in the county of jurisdiction.

TRIAL WEEK JUDICIAL ASSIGNMENTS

Jury Trials will be scheduled during the first four weeks of the month. The first trial week

will begin the first Monday of the month. Except as approved by the Chief Judge, judges of the divisions set forth below will schedule trials and reserve their calendar as primary and back-up judges, as indicated, until it has been determined that trials are covered circuitwide.

TEMPORARY ASSIGNMENTS OF COUNTY COURT JUDGES AS CIRCUIT JUDGES

Hon. Jeanne D. Crenshaw, Hon. Aymer L. Curtin, Hon. Phyllis D. Kotey, Hon. Ysleta W. McDonald, Hon. James P. Nilon, Hon. Joseph M. Williams, Hon. Johnny R. Hobbs, Jr., Hon. Edward Philman, Hon. Joseph E. Smith, and Hon. David L. Reiman, County Court Judges for Alachua, Baker, Bradford, Gilchrist, Levy and Union Counties are hereby temporarily appointed Circuit Judges for the Eighth Judicial Circuit. Under this appointment they are vested with all and singular powers and prerogatives conferred by the Constitution and Laws of the State of Florida as a Circuit Judge on a temporary basis to hear, conduct and determine all matters which are presented to them as follows:

1. **Temporary injunctions in domestic** §§741.30 and 784.046, Florida Statutes;
and repeat **violence** cases under
2. **Baker and Marchman** Act cases and Chapters 394, 397, 415, 916, and 945, Florida
cases arising under Statutes;
3. **Juvenile detention** hearings under Chapters 39, 984 and 985, Florida Statutes;
4. **Medical treatment** and examination Chapters 415, 743, 39, 390, 765, 400, 381, 384,
cases arising under 393, 916, 394, and 945, Florida Statutes;
5. Any matters arising **during on-call or back-up duty judge hours** when the duty judge is
a County Court Judge;
6. Orders of **Arrest** and Orders of **Release** for civil contempt which arise pursuant to
hearing and recommendation of the **Child Support Enforcement** Hearing Officer.
7. hear, conduct and determine all matters pertaining to **bail** in felony cases at first
appearance hearings, even though a circuit judge may have initially set bail upon the
issuance of a *capias*, **EXCEPT** in the following instances:
 - a. any alleged offense within the jurisdiction of the Circuit Court where a
Circuit Judge endorsing the *capias* bail specifically provides that such bail
shall not be reduced except upon order of a Circuit Judge;
 - b. where a sentence for contempt has already been imposed;
8. **Arrest warrants** and **search warrants**, including petitions, motions or applications;
9. Conduct **first appearance** for all arrestees who are being detained pursuant to an order of
arrest for **civil contempt connected with child support enforcement** and, unless
designated as “do not adjust” on the arrest order, to order release and reduce purge
amount upon the arrestee signing the Notice to Appear and agreeing to return for further
hearing before the Child Support Enforcement Hearing Officer;
