**AMENDED GENERAL ASSIGNMENT OF JUDGES ORDER**

*March 25, 2002, through June 30, 2002*

*Whereas*, Florida Rule of Judicial Administration 2.050 requires the Chief Judge to develop an administrative plan for all courts within this circuit that is “compatible with the development of the capabilities of the judges in such a manner that each judge will be qualified to serve in any division;”

*Whereas*, the geography of this circuit requires temporary assignments of county judges in circuit court to provide prompt disposition of cases and to efficiently administer the courts, *see*, Art. V, § 11(b), Fla. Const., and *Judges of the Polk County Court by Herring, v. Ernst*, 615 So. 2d 276 (2d DCA 1993) (assignment of circuit court jurisdiction to a county judge must be temporary); it is therefore

**ORDERED** the assignments set forth in this order are reflected on a Master Calendar which is hereby incorporated. The Master Calendar is published annually and may be revised as needed by order of the Chief Judge.

#### **PROCEDURE FOR CALENDARING CIRCUIT COURT CASES**

All cases under circuit court jurisdiction shall be calendared before the circuit judge assigned to the division in which the case has been filed. When a rule, statute or procedure mandates expedited judicial action on a matter and the judge assigned to the division is unavailable, the Chief Judge shall assign a judge to hear the case or cases pursuant to this order. The acting, presiding

judge will be the next available circuit judge or a county judge in the county of jurisdiction.

### TRIAL WEEK JUDICIAL ASSIGNMENTS

Jury Trials will be scheduled during the first four weeks of the month. The first trial week will begin the first Monday of the month. Except as approved by the Chief Judge, judges of the divisions set forth below will schedule trials and reserve their calendar as primary and back-up judges, as indicated, until it has been determined that trials are covered circuit wide.

**TEMPORARY ASSIGNMENTS OF COUNTY COURT JUDGES AS CIRCUIT JUDGES**

Hon. Jeanne D. Crenshaw, Hon. Aymer L. Curtin, Hon. Phyllis D. Kotey, Hon. Ysleta W. McDonald, Hon. James P. Nilon, Hon. Joseph M. Williams, Hon. Johnny R. Hobbs, Jr., Hon. Edward Philman, Hon. Joseph E. Smith, and Hon. David L. Reiman, County Court Judges for Alachua, Baker, Bradford, Gilchrist, Levy and Union Counties are hereby temporarily appointed Circuit Judges for the Eighth Judicial Circuit. Under this appointment they are vested with all and singular powers and prerogatives conferred by the Constitution and Laws of the State of Florida as a Circuit Judge on a temporary basis to hear, conduct and determine all matters which are presented to them as follows:

1. **Temporary injunctions in domestic** sections 741.30 and 784.046, Florida Statutes; and repeat **violence** cases under
2. **Juvenile detention** hearings (in Chapters 39 and 984, Florida Statutes and delinquency cases) and **Shelter** sections 985.213, 215, Florida Statutes hearings under (detention hearings);
3. **Mental health and medical** Chapters 39, 384, 392, 393, 394, 397, 415, 765, **treatment**, examination or testing 916, and 945; and sections 381.04 (3)(h)(10) & cases arising under (11) and 390.01115 (4), Florida Statutes;
4. Any matters arising **during on-call or back-up duty judge hours**;
5. Orders of **Arrest** and Orders of **Release** for civil contempt upon the **Child Support Enforcement** Hearing Officer's recommendation.
6. Hear and determine all **bail** issues in felony cases at first appearance hearings, even though a circuit judge initially set bail upon the issuance of a *capias* or a warrant, **except** where a sentence for contempt has already been imposed;
7. **Arrest warrants** and **search warrants**, including petitions, motions or applications;
8. Conduct **first appearance** for arrestees who are detained pursuant to an order of arrest for **civil contempt connected with child support enforcement** and, unless designated as "do not adjust" on the arrest order, to order release and reduce the purge amount upon the arrestee signing the Notice to Appear and agreeing to return for further hearing before the Child Support Enforcement Hearing Officer.
